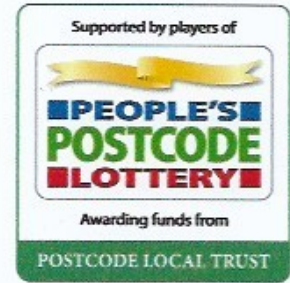

COMMUNITY-CONSERVATION-CULTIVATION

The KCG is an area of hawthorn and ash trees, scrubland, mown open areas, gardening plots and an orchard. There are footpaths through the area. People are welcome to walk through the KCG in day light hours and walk dogs, as long as they 'poop and scoop'. There are dog bins at the entrances. Small children need to be supervised by an adult. People using the site do so at their own risk.

Where? - It is in the northern part of the village with Old Manor Gardens to the south, the Railway Terrace to the west and the gardens of Windmill Road to the east. Access is from the main gate at the end of Old Manor Gardens and by foot entrance near Abbots Way. See below for an aerial view.
