PUMPKIN GROWING COMPETITION 2012

- The pumpkin can be grown at home or if you have a plot in the KCG. Only Kemble and Ewen residents and plot holders can apply.
- The winning pumpkin has the widest circumference.
- £3 ENTRY FEE—5 seeds are provided when you register.
- Winner takes two thirds of the entry fees with the rest going to the Kemble Community Gardens.
- Judging will take place at the KCG Garden Party in September—date to be arranged
- All pumpkins to be presented 'on the vine' (no supermarket impostors please!)

SUNFLOWER GROWING COMPETITION 2012

For KCG plot holders only:

- The winner has the tallest sunflower which must be grown in the KCG. The best results happen when you plant the seeds straight in the ground. The sunflowers will need staking.
- £3 entry fee—5 seeds are provided when you register and prize as for the Pumpkin Competition
- Competition will be judged at the September party.
